



Centrale Paris has won a new Erasmus Mundus

(Paris, Friday July 19, 2013) – Leading a consortium of 12 European, Japanese and Korean partners, Centrale Paris has been awarded a new EM program - EM EASED with a budget of 1,25 million euros from the European Union taking part of the 2009-2013 Erasmus Mundus Program for its new program EM-EASED (Euro-Asian Sustainable Energy Development).

The EM-EASED program (2013-2017) is a follow-up of a previous mobility scheme EM-BEAM (2010-2014) which was opened to a wide variety of research fields. EM-EASED aims to bring Europe and the Far East (Japan, Korea) closer in the field of research and its management with a special emphasis on Energy.

This research program includes Engineering and Technology, as well as Mathematics and Computer Science, Natural Sciences or Architecture fields. The partnership will enable the mutual esteem and recognition at the institutional level, accented by the Bologna Process and will contribute to the Lisbon objectives of a common higher education space and the knowledge society.

By cooperating and working together, the EM-EASED partnership will contribute to the development of Euro-Asian bridges in excellence and help the promotion of scientific, economic and cultural exchanges. Facing the strong challenges for the European, Japanese and Korean Knowledge Society, EM-EASED will help universities and associated research centers to find adequate answers especially by promoting internationalization, quality and excellence in their activities. The program will allow the most talented students to benefit from a mobility period and to be in contact with new research environments, making them more innovative in their activities, active in their educational path and their career plan. The administrative and research teams involved will also benefit a lot from the opportunity to be pooled and to work together during the program and its events.

The EM-EASED program is mainly dedicated to research exchanges and is intended to establish a mobility scheme for about 72 individuals including doctorates (58%), post-doctorates (17%) and staff (25%). More than 66% of the individuals will be European. The programme is strongly focused on, but not restricted to, energy related projects.
